

*Saint Michael is the patron of the Gargano Mountains. Many times, when dealing with troubled souls, Padre Pio would recommend a visit to the Basilica of St. Michael on Mont St. Angelo not far from San Giovanni Rotondo.

Often times, he would hand out a prayer card to St. Michael—encouraging people to have a devotion to him. In these troubled times, we should all take heed of Padre Pio's advice and call upon St. Michael for help.

HISTORY OF THE SANCTUARY OF MONTE SANT' ANGELO

The history of this Shrine to St. Michael dates as far back as the year 490, when St. Michael appeared to a Catholic bishop on this mountain that contained an opening to a cave. According to tradition, it all started when a local nobleman named Elvio Emmanuele lost the best bull of his herd. After much searching, he found it kneeling in a cave. Unable to approach it, Elvio shot the bull with an arrow, but the arrow turned around and struck himself instead in the foot. Bewildered, Elvio went to see his bishop, who ordered three days of prayer and fasting. At the end of the three days, St. Michael the Archangel appeared to the bishop and said: **"I am Michael the Archangel, and am always in the presence of God. I chose the cave that is sacred to me. I myself, am its watchful custodian. There will be no more shedding of bull's blood. Where the rocks openly widely the sins of men may be pardoned. What is asked for here in prayer will be granted. Therefore, go to the mountain cave and dedicate it to the Christian God!"**

(It is perhaps notable that the central ritual of the Roman cult of Mithraism is the shedding of bull's blood in caves). The bishop, however, began to worry about his own sanity and dismissed the vision. Two years later, the Christian city Siponto, part of the bishop's diocese, came under attack by the pagan city of Odoacre. Again St. Michael appeared to the bishop, this time promising to save the city of Siponto. Immediately, a violent storm engulfed Odoacre, saving the Christian city. In thanksgiving, the bishop led a procession to the top of the mountain but did not dare to enter the cave.

Soon, Michael appeared to the bishop a third time, ordering him to enter the cave. He said: **"It is not necessary that you dedicate this church that I have consecrated with my presence, enter and pray with my assistance and celebrate the sacrifice. I will show you how I have consecrated this place."** The bishop then entered the grotto, where he found an altar covered with a red cloth, a crystal cross, and a footprint on the ground (which can still be seen to this day). The bishop thereupon commissioned the chapel to be built at the entrance to the cave and **did not** consecrate it because Michael had already done so. The church came to be known as the **"Celestial Basilica"**.

The history of this grotto continues... in the year 1656, a terrible pestilence

raged all over Southern Italy. The Archbishop of the region had recourse to the Archangel Michael with prayers and fasting. The Archbishop even thought of forcing the Divine Will "by placing a supplication written in the name of all the towns-people in the hands of the statue of Saint Michael. And then as dawn was breaking on September 22, (remember that date—September 22nd) while he was praying in a room of the bishop's palace of Monte Sant' Angelo, there was a sort of earthquake and Saint Michael appeared to him in dazzling splendor and ordered him to bless the stones of the grotto engraving them with the sign of the cross and the letters MA (Michael Archangel). Very soon, not only the town was delivered from the plague, but also all those who asked for the stones wherever they lived." Finally St. Michael is pleased and grants a proof of his approval by the curing of his devotees from the plague! As a perpetual memento of the prodigy and out of eternal gratitude, the Archbishop erected a monument to Saint Michael in the town square:

**"TO THE PRINCE OF THE ANGELS,
CONQUEROR OF THE PLAGUE
PATRON AND GUARDIAN,
WE PLACE THIS MONUMENT,
IN ETERNAL GRATITUDE"**

And so, September 22nd was the date of this wonderful prodigy! This also happens to be the eve of the anniversary of Padre Pio's death.

Padre Pio



Father Alessio Parente, a Capuchin friar who took care of Padre Pio for the last six years of his life, was quoted as saying that "the devil came every day to beat Padre Pio". When this would occur the whole monastery would shake. He would know what was happening and quickly run to Padre Pio's room to find him in a pool of blood on the floor severely beaten. Padre Pio suffered these beatings for the salvation of souls. When Padre Pio would cry out for Jesus to have mercy on him, St. Michael would then appear

and Satan would leave him. St. Michael along with the Blessed Mother and St. Francis of Assisi (who also visited Mont Sant' Angelo and slept on a rock outside the cave where an imprint of his face was left on the rock and which is visible to this day) and Padre Pio's Guardian Angel were his daily companions.

Therefore as St. Michael was a special guardian of Padre Pio in life, would he not also be his guardian in his final repose? As Padre Pio is quoted as saying, **"I will make more noise when I am dead than when I was alive!"** Perhaps, in the great noise that Pio will make, St. Michael will be there as ready as ever to assist him in his battles with Satan!
